YEAR 1

Year I had their trip to 'Amuzeum Discovery' in Tamaris this week and they thoroughly enjoyed it! There was lots of learning taking place alongside the fun activities at the venue. We are pleased the children enjoyed their first visit there!

In English, for our writing activity, we went outside to write with a focus on the nature around them. The children enjoyed it so much and that led them to be more creative in their writing. In humanities, we learned about the different stages of a plant life cycle and we also listened to a wonderful presentation on how to plant a banana as well as the lifecycle of a banana.

In humanities, our current topic is 'Shaping up', and we've been spending plenty of time on the football pitch and basketball court, energising our bodies and creating our very own games. The students' creativity has truly shone through their game creations. I encourage you to ask them about it; they would be delighted to describe their games in detail. One of their all-time hilarious hits was a game where they had to contort their bodies into shapes studied in maths, collaborating in groups to form mind-boggling human sculptures. It was like witnessing a contortionist circus on steroids! On another note, we have been celebrating

YEAR 4

The children have really enjoyed learning all about electricity in Science and some children designed and built their own projects that comprised electrical circuits. Neil created a fantastic circuit that comprised two light bulbs and incorporated a switch to control the on/off function. Soulaymane made a working diorama using electrical circuits to model how the Sun shines on the Earth as it spins to replicate night and day. IT is wonderful to see such creativity in Year 4!



YEAR 5

This term's English studies in 5B have been based on the book 'How to Train Your Dragon', which we have been reading as a class. In art, the children learned how to make paper look old by staining it with tea in art, and each produced an 'aged' map outline of the setting, the Isle of Berk. After allowing the maps to dry, the children then added places and geographical features from the story to their maps, and added a key to explain the symbols.

This week we spent two whole days in secondary school to prepare for the big step next year. We were split into two classes and met our future teachers, like Mr Grogan (for Art) and Mr.Williams (for Science) and had many exciting lessons with them. Overall, playing with the secondary students and beating them in football was the highlight of the day.
