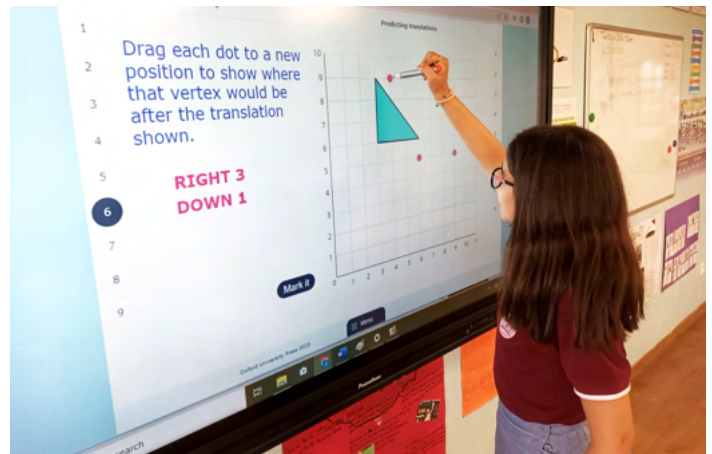
## YEAR 4
