#### RECEPTION



Reception children enjoyed an active week of learning.Craft activities for Mother's Day included designing and making precious cards and gifts. In maths, we discussed time and used interactive clocks. In phonics, children recalled sounds and digraphs to read Phase 3 high-frequency words. Please continue to practise these common words and spellings during the holidays. This consistent approach will help boost your child's reading confidence and fluency.

Sports Day was the finale. All the children enjoyed a range of exciting sporting activities. Sports games included a mix of fundamental movements such as jumping, skipping and running to complete the circuits. Children accepted an award for participation. ## YEAR 1

We have seen great progress this term with the children in year I and cannot believe we only have one half term left! During the last few weeks of year I, we have International Day preparations and the final year I assessments so please ensure your children are punctual to school.

### YEAR 2



In the humanities, we learnt about offspring and how they change as they grow. We compared the adult to the child to see if they look similar. We also learnt about animals that grow from eggs and animals that grow inside their mum.

#### YEAR 3



Year 3 put pen to paper and peeked at poetry this week. Our focus has been looking at poems with different structures so we began by looking at an old, but fun form of poetry, kennings, which use lines of two words to give the reader tantalising clues about the subject. We discovered the rules needed to write a kenning poem then wrote our own poems about and had our classmates guess what they were about. Next, we learned all about alliteration and used a variety of 's' words to write a shape poem about some slithery, scaly, slidey old snakes.



### YEAR 4

This week, we went on a class trip to La Ferme Pedagogique in Dar Bouazza. The children had a fun and relaxing time learning all about how bees produce honey and the process of how bread is manufactured. They made their own bread, which they really enjoyed doing and the children showed some super baking skills! Year 4 also learned how to use a bow to fire soft arrows at a target, played Tug of War and showed their



competitive edge during some team games. The children had a picnic on the grass and finished off on the trampolines. All in all, a great day out!

#### YEAR 5



In maths we were learning about interpreting different timetables commonly seen on buses and trains. We combined maths with our art lesson and the students were able to design their own clocks so they could tell the time in both the analogue 12 hour format and the digital 24 hour format.

#### YEAR 6

This week, Year 6 continued learning about the environment, researching and answering reading comprehensions on the topic, which led to new and interesting information entering our brains. We also worked on designing environmental awareness posters and campaigns, using our imagination and online resources for inspiration.
